Environmental Appeals Board hearing schedule: Lisa Ball, 541466 Alberta Ltd., and Robert Beaverford

The Environmental Appeals Board will conduct a hearing on June 22, 2022, via video conference, commencing at 8:30 am.

The Board will hear submissions with respect to the March 12, 2021 decisions of Alberta Environment and Parks, to issue *Water Act* Enforcement Order No. E0-WA-35659-01 and *Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act* Environmental Protection Order No. EPO-EPEA-35659-07 in relation to a gravel pit on public land located at SW-13-065-18-W4M in Athabasca County. The appeals being heard on June 22, 2022 are only those of Lisa Ball, 541466 Alberta Ltd. and Robert Beaverford. The Orders were issued to: 2161889 Alberta Ltd.; Byron Levkulich, former Director of 2161889 Alberta Ltd., JMB Crushing Systems Inc.; Aaron Patsch, former Director of 2161889 Alberta Ltd., JMB Crushing Systems Inc.; Jeffrey Buck, former Director of 2161889 Alberta Ltd., JMB Crushing Systems Inc.; Lisa Ball, former Director of 2161889 Alberta Ltd.; 541466 Alberta Ltd.; and Robert W. Beaverford.

The only issue to be heard at this hearing will be whether Alberta Environment and Parks had the authority to name Lisa Ball, 541466 Alberta Ltd., and Robert Beaverford as parties in Environmental Protection Order EPO-EPEA-35659-07 and Enforcement Order EO-WA-35659-01.

The Environmental Appeals Board is a separate and independent body that reviews certain decisions made by Alberta Environment and Parks. The Board is composed of environmental experts from a variety of disciplines.

Any person, other than the parties, who wishes to make a representation before the Board on this appeal must submit a request by fax or by e-mail to the Board. The request must be received by the Board on or before December 21, 2021. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that their

request has been received. The request shall (a) contain the name, address, e-mail, and telephone and fax numbers of the person submitting the request, (b) indicate whether the person submitting the request intends to be represented by a lawyer or agent and, if so, the name of the lawyer or agent, and (c) contain a summary of the nature of the person's interest in this appeal. Applications will only be considered if the information will assist the Board in making its decision, and will not duplicate the information provided by the parties. After December 21, 2021, the Board will determine if other persons may make representations and the manner in which they can be made.

Since the hearing is being held via video conference, it will not be open to the public for viewing. You may request a copy of the audio recording.
